- Often dose dependent
- Treatment: standard acne regimen

• Often due to sirolimus

• Treatment: prescription oral retinoid

- Sirolimus, Everolimus, Tacrolimus, Cyclosporine, Mycophenolate,
- Treatment: prescription steroid paste

Transplant Recipients get more skin cancer



Incidence of breast cancer: 120 per 100,000 p-ys Incidence of lung cancer: 300 per 100,000 p-ys

Incidence of skin cancer in transplant recipients: 1400 per 100,000 p-ys

- Early detection improves survival
- UV radiation (sun or tanning beds) cause this cancer

Skin cancer screening



- Recommendations depend on the organ you receive and your risk of skin cancer prior to transplant
 - At minimum, every 2-3 years
 - Some patients see me every 3 months
- Skin cancer prior to transplant?
 - See me more frequently
